

Executive Summary

Pakistan reported **782** new cases of COVID-19 on **06 August 2020**. The total number of cases notified since the beginning of the outbreak is **282,645** with **6,052** deaths **(CFR: 2.14%)**. Out of the total **18,494** currently active cases, **1,294** cases are hospitalized, out of which **826 (63.83%)** are in critical condition. **17,200** COVID-19 positive cases are at designated isolation facilities or inhome isolation. A total of **258,099 (91.31%)** have recovered and discharged.

Daily incidence of COVID-19 cases in Pakistan




COVID-19 case density/million Population

Daily Mortality in Pakistan



Meeting & Coordination

Today 7th August 2020, WHO country Representative Pakistan, Dr Palitha Mahipala chaired a planning meeting to review WHO Pakistan COVID-19 plan (April – July) and to develop the plan for the next six months. The Incident Manger Dr Michael Lukwiya gave introductory remakes followed by presentations by the Technical team members. Key areas of focus in the next six months will include strengthening surveillance (sentinel, PoE and IDSR), laboratory strengthening, case management and IPC and community mobilization and sensitization and coordination of the response.

Maintaining Essential Health Services in Pakistan

WHO is supporting national and provincial malaria programs for the maintenance of essential care during COVID -19 response. Virtual international and national consultative meetings and training courses in malaria and NTDs have been done. Additionally, WHO has supported provision of essential medicine for the treatment of cutaneous Leishmaniasis in outbreak hit districts of KP and Baluchistan. WHO continue to support provision of MDT drugs for leprosy patients. Plan of action/concept note for donor support to emerging situation of Dengue in the country in the post monsoon season is under development.




Service delivery on Leishmaniasis in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa




COVID-19 confirmed cases & CFR (%) by districts
