

Executive Summary

Pakistan reported 394 new cases of COVID-19 on 6 September 2020. The total number of cases notified since the beginning of the outbreak is 298,903 with 6,345 deaths (CFR: 2.12%). Out of the total 6,542 currently active cases, 1,050 cases are hospitalized, out of which **534 (50.85%)** are in critical condition. **5,492** COVID-19 positive cases are at designated isolation facilities or inhome isolation. A total of 286,016 (95.68%) have recovered and discharged.





Daily Incidence by Province





Daily COVID-19 Positivity Rate




COVID-19 Confirmed cases & CFR

by Major Cities / Districts



FLOOD SITUATION

Monday, 7th September 2020

In Pakistan, the monsoon season are going on and in the recent spell of rains from 5th to 6th September 2020, new incident was reported in 05 districts of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa and 04 districts of Punjab province. According to NDMA, most of the impact of the rains and floods occurred in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa province, which recorded **4 new injuries** but no death, 06 houses fully and 16 houses partially damaged during 5th& 6th September 2020.

To date over **246 deaths**, over **170** Injuries have been recorded as a result of heavy rains and floods in the country. Over, **1,365** houses fully and **1,265 partially** damaged since 15th June. See the table below for details.




