





### **INCIDENCE & DEATHS BY DATE**






**TOTAL CASES & CASES PER MILLION POP.** 

Pakistan reported **1,037** new cases of COVID-19 on **7**<sup>th</sup> **February 2021**. The total number of cases notified since the beginning of the outbreak is **555,511** with **12,026** deaths **(CFR: 2.16%)**. Out of the total **31,983** currently active cases **2,253** cases are hospitalized.

### **MEETINGS & COORDINATION**

On 8<sup>th</sup> February 2021, World Health Organization Pakistan in collaboration with the Drug Regulatory Authority of Pakistan (DRAP), Ministry of National Health Services, Regulations and Coordination conducted one day training on monitoring adverse Events Following Immunization (AEFI) and Pharmacovigilance for COVID-19 Vaccines. The training was conducted at Ramada Hotel Islamabad.

A total of 35 participants including provincial focal persons of EPI and DRAP attended the training. The objective of the training was to build capacity of participants in monitoring the adverse events following immunization with COVID-19 vaccines, to ensure its safety and build public trust on the immunization process.
