

# **Executive Summary**

Pakistan reported **634** new cases of COVID-19 on **08** August **2020**. The total number of cases notified since the beginning of the outbreak is **284,121** with **6,082** deaths (CFR: **2.14%**). Out of the total **17,791** currently active cases, **1,334** cases are hospitalized, out of which **791** (**59.29%**) are in critical condition. **16,457** COVID-19 positive cases are at designated isolation facilities or inhome isolation. A total of **260,248** (**91.5%**) have recovered and discharged.

#### Daily incidence of COVID-19 cases in Pakistan






## **COVID-19 case density/million Population**






### **Meeting & Coordination**

World Health Organization Pakistan in collaboration with National Institute of Health Islamabad and Provincial Health Department Punjab organized a three days training (5<sup>th</sup> to 7<sup>th</sup> August) of 16 participants from South Punjab. The participants comprised of laboratory technicians, laboratory in charges and pathologist. The training involved presentation and practical performance of COVID-19 real time PCR and QS5 machine, laboratory quality and bio-risk management. The PCR machines were donated by World Health Organization Pakistan as a commitment to enhance the laboratory testing capacity.

#### Maintaining Essential Health Services in Pakistan

The World Health Organization, Pakistan in collaboration with provincial health department, Sindh conducted the 2<sup>nd</sup> phase of "Enhanced Outreach activity" (EOA) for the improvement of immunization coverage of children during the ongoing outbreak of COVID-19.






# COVID-19 confirmed cases & CFR (%) by districts
