## MEETING AND COORDINATION

On 8<sup>th</sup> March 2021, World Health Organization Pakistan in collaboration with Provincial Health Department Sindh, Pakistan Nursing Council and the Indus university of health sciences Karachi started 10 days Training on the Infection Prevention and Control (IPC) for the first batch of Nurse trainers. The purpose of the training is to train the Provincial Nurses on IPC. The training is being conducted at Sindh Nurses Examination Directorate Karachi.

The Director General, Directorate of Nursing Sindh / Sindh Nurses examination Board (SNEB), Ms. Khair-un-Nisa Akber and Additional Secretary Public Health, Dr Naseer Meerani graced the inaugural session. 15 nurses will be trained as provincial nurses' IPC trainers in Sindh. These Master Trainers will conduct further training of nurses in the province. The Director General Ms Khair-un-Nisa expressed her gratitude to WHO for their support in capacity building of nurses in Sindh province on Infection Prevention and Control.
