


SITUATION REPORT COVID-19 PAKISTAN







Pakistan reported **671** new cases of COVID-19 on **09 October 2020**. The total number of cases notified since the beginning of the outbreak is **318,266** with **6,558** deaths (CFR: 2.06%). Out of the total **8,646** currently active cases, **781** cases are hospitalized, out of which **475 (60.82%)** are in critical condition. **7,865** COVID-19 positive cases are at designated isolation facilities or inhome isolation. A total of **303,062 (95.22%)** have recovered and discharged.




Daily COVID-19 Positivity Rate




(Last 24hrs) COVID-19 Positivity rates by Province
