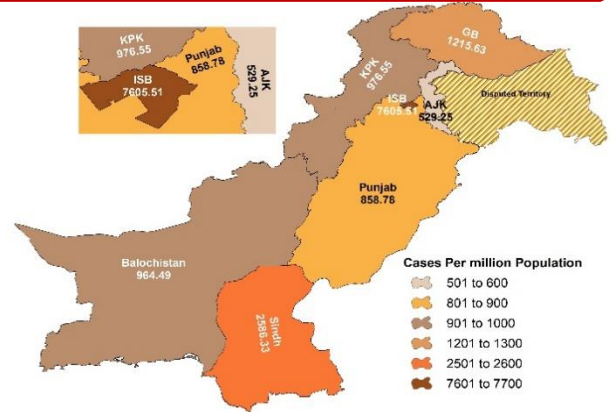

### COVID-19 case density/million Population

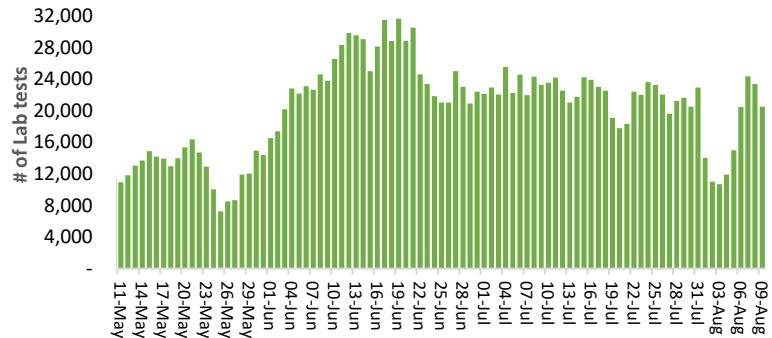


### Executive Summary

Pakistan reported **539** new cases of COVID-19 on **09 August 2020**. The total number of cases notified since the beginning of the outbreak is **284,660** with **6,097** deaths (**CFR: 2.14%**). Out of the total **17,799** currently active cases, **1,357** cases are hospitalized, out of which **776 (57.18%)** are in critical condition. **16,442** COVID-19 positive cases are at designated isolation facilities or in-home isolation. A total of **260,764 (91.60%)** have recovered and discharged.

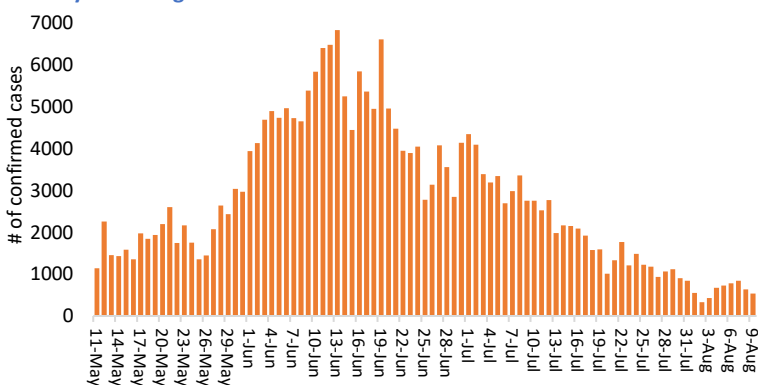
### Daily Lab tests conducted in Pakistan

10 May to 09 Aug 2020



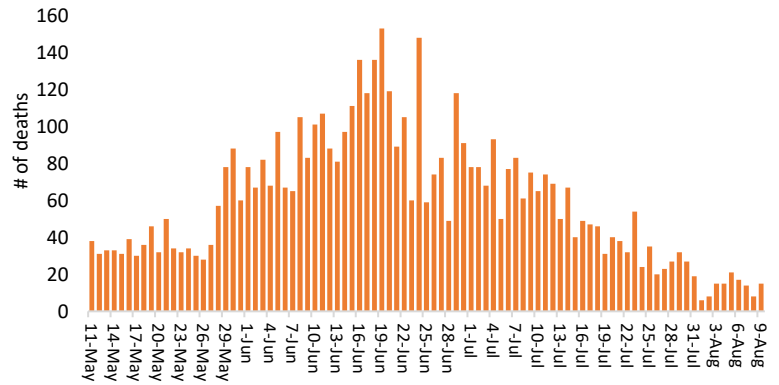
### Daily incidence of COVID-19 cases in Pakistan

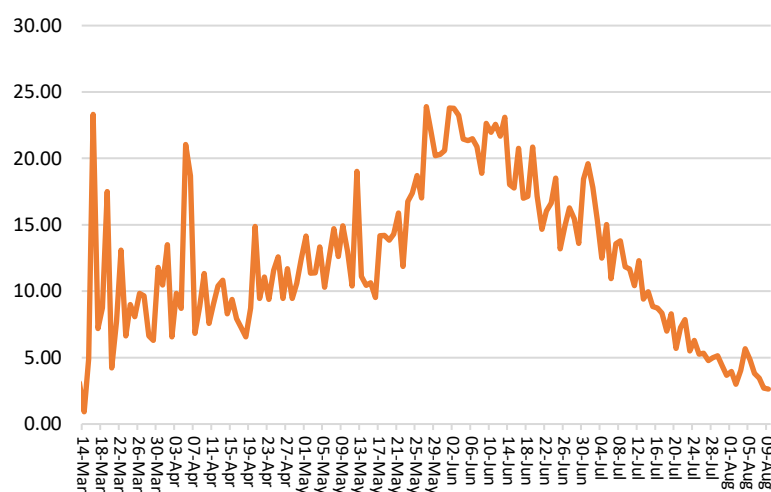

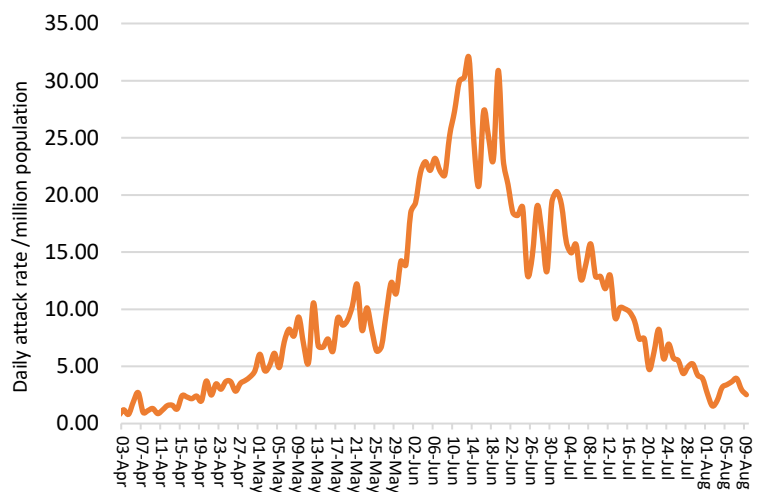
## Meeting & Coordination

Today, 10th August 2020, The World Health Organization Country Representative, Pakistan Dr Palitha Mahipala, met the Parliamentary Health Secretary Dr. Rubaba Khan Buledi and Secretary Health Mr Dosteen Jamaladini at provincial civil secretariat Quetta. During the meeting the WR handed over one PCR Machine as part of WHO commitment to enhance country capacity for COVID-19 epidemic response and 40 IHK kits as part of WHO support to the flood's situation in Baluchistan. The Parliamentary Health Secretary expressed her gratitude to WHO for their continued support to Pakistan in combating COVID-19 outbreak and supporting response to the ongoing floods.

## Daily Positivity rate in Pakistan



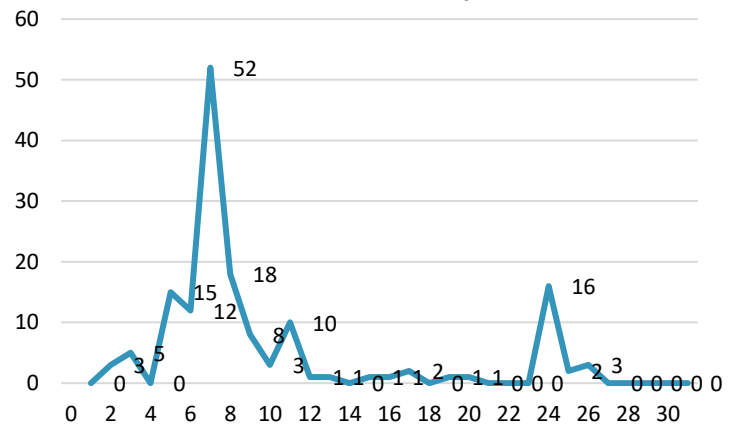
## Daily Attack rate/million population



## Maintaining Essential Health Services in Pakistan

WHO Pakistan continues to support the government to monitor trends of vaccine preventable diseases. On average 90% of reporting sites provided their weekly report on time. In 2020, a total of 1,805 measles cases and 80 rubella cases were reported. This represent measles incidence rate of 7.89 and rubella incidence rate to 0.35 per million of population. A total of 21 Measles outbreaks were reported from Punjab, Sindh and Baluchistan. In response, immunization (ORI) activities were conducted and 72,041 children under 5 were vaccinated.

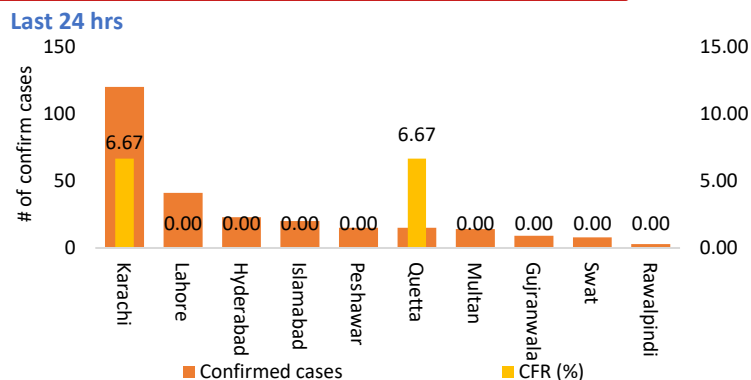
## Measles outbreaks' cases by week 2020



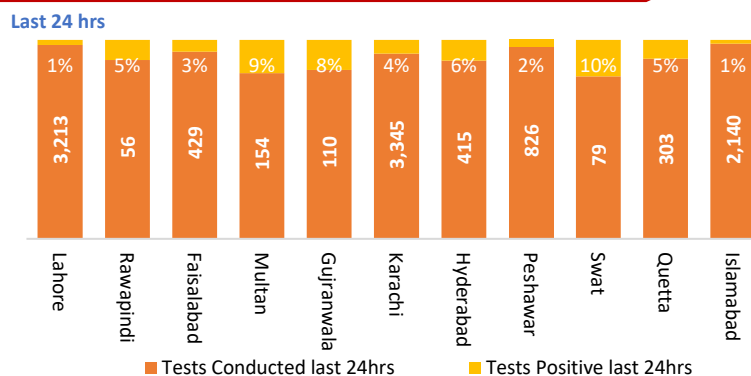

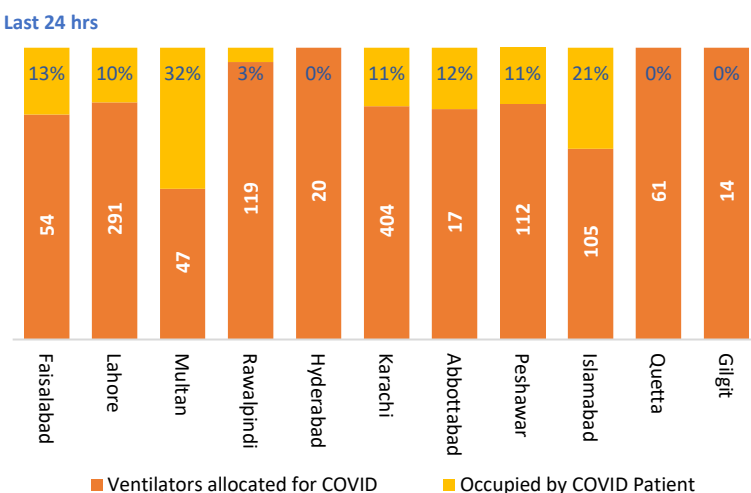
## COVID-19 confirmed cases & CFR (%) by districts
