

Executive Summary

Pakistan reported **531** new cases of COVID-19 on **10 August 2020**. The total number of cases notified since the beginning of the outbreak is **285,191** with **6,112** deaths **(CFR: 2.14%)**. Out of the total **17,834** currently active cases, **1,365** cases are hospitalized, out of which **780 (57.14%)** are in critical condition. **16,469** COVID-19 positive cases are at designated isolation facilities or inhome isolation. A total of **261,246 (91.60%)** have recovered and discharged.

Daily incidence of COVID-19 cases in Pakistan






COVID-19 case density/million Population

Daily Mortality in Pakistan






Meeting & Coordination

Maintaining Essential Health Services in Pakistan

Essential medical services in Balochistan continued during the COVID-19 response period though not at full capacity. As the number of COVID-19 cases started to decline in July 2020 the capacity to provide essential medical services increased. It was during this time that Balochistan Children Hospital (BCHQ) reopened the WHO supported Nutrition Stabilisation Centre (NSC). WHO provided supplies for establishment of the NSC including stocks of therapeutic milk F75 and F100, RUTF and training in inpatient treatment of severely acutely malnourished children with complications. A formal letter of understanding was signed on July 2, 2020 by BCHQ, WHO and Provincial Nutrition Directorate (PND) for WHO to support BCHQ.








COVID-19 confirmed cases & CFR (%) by districts
