





INCIDENCE & DEATHS BY DATE




TOTAL CASES & CASES PER MILLION POP.




Pakistan reported **1,270** new cases of COVID-19 on **11**th **February 2021**. The total number of cases notified since the beginning of the outbreak is **560,363** with **12,218** deaths **(CFR: 2.18%)**. Out of the total **29,981** currently active cases **2,162** cases are hospitalized.

MEETINGS & COORDINATION

On 11th February 2021, World Health Organization Pakistan in collaboration with Aga Khan University (AKU) and the National AIDS Control Program Pakistan conducted virtual meeting to disseminate the updated National HIV Treatment Guidelines. WHO supported the National AIDS Control Program Pakistan in updating and adaptation of the national HIV treatment guidelines. Over 70 physicians from all over Pakistan participated in the session.

Speaking on the occasion, WHO EMR Regional Advisor HIV/Hepatitis/SDIs, Ms. Journana Hermez, lauded the efforts of national manager for initiating impactful interventions for improving HIV situation in the country and assured full support of WHO in responding to critically low HIV testing and treatment coverage in the region.

Dr Ayesha Majeed Isani, Deputy National Coordinator Common Management Unit for HIV, acknowledged WHO support for strengthening the different service delivery for HIV management.
