


PAKISTAN COVID-19 SITUATION REPORT

Meetings & Coordination





On 11th August 2021, Ministry of National Health Services Regulations and Coordination, Nutrition wing in collaboration with World Health Organization Pakistan commemorated the World Breastfeeding Week (WBFW) 2021 with a walk. The theme for the 2021 Breastfeeding Week is "Protect Breast feeding - a shared responsibility". The walk aimed at creating awareness on the importance of promoting and protecting breastfeeding. Honorable Adviser to Prime Minister on Health, Dr. Faisal Sultan along with WHO Country representative Pakistan, Dr Palitha Mahipala, joined the walk.

Dr. Palitha Mahipala emphasized that early initiation of breastfeeding within the first hour of birth, followed by exclusive breastfeeding for six months and continued breastfeeding along with complementary age specific diet for up to two years is pivotal in addressing burden of malnutrition in later part of life.

In his closing remarks Dr Faisal, thanked WHO Pakistan for their technical support and highlighted that breastfeeding is one of the cost-effective interventions for reducing malnutrition among children.
