

SITUATION REPORT OVID-19 PAKISTAN








Pakistan reported 385 new cases of COVID-19 on 11 October 2020. The total number of cases notified since the beginning of the outbreak is 319,317 with 6,580 deaths (CFR: 2.06%). Out of the total 8,552 currently active cases, 804 cases are hospitalized, out of which 491 (61.07%) are in critical condition. 7,748 COVID-19 positive cases are at designated isolation facilities or inhome isolation. A total of 304,185 (95.26%) have recovered and discharged.




Daily COVID-19 Positivity Rate






COVID-19 Positivity rates by Province (Last 24hrs)
