

Executive Summary

Pakistan reported **730** new cases of COVID-19 on **11 August 2020**. The total number of cases notified since the beginning of the outbreak is **285,921** with **6,129** deaths **(CFR: 2.14%)**. Out of the total **16,599** currently active cases, **1,344** cases are hospitalized, out of which **785 (58.40%)** are in critical condition. **15,255** COVID-19 positive cases are at designated isolation facilities or inhome isolation. A total of **263,193 (92.05%)** have recovered and discharged.

Daily incidence of COVID-19 cases in Pakistan






COVID-19 case density/million Population

Daily Mortality in Pakistan










COVID-19 confirmed cases & CFR (%) by districts Last 24 hrs
