

#### **Executive Summary**

Pakistan reported **753** new cases of COVID-19 on **12 August 2020**. The total number of cases notified since the beginning of the outbreak is **286,674** with **6,139** deaths **(CFR: 2.14%)**. Out of the total **16,475** currently active cases, **1,341** cases are hospitalized, out of which **783 (58.38%)** are in critical condition. **15,134** COVID-19 positive cases are at designated isolation facilities or inhome isolation. A total of **264,060 (92.11%)** have recovered and discharged.

#### Daily incidence of COVID-19 cases in Pakistan




# **COVID-19 case density/million Population**



#### Daily Lab tests conducted in Pakistan




#### **Daily Mortality in Pakistan**

#### **Coordination & Meetings**

Today, 13<sup>th</sup> August 2020, WHO Country Representative, Pakistan Dr Palitha Mahipala chaired a meeting between the WHO Pakistan and the Institute of Public Health (IPH), Lahore. The team from IPH Lahore was led by the Chairman Board of Management Gen Rtd. Khalid Maqbool. The objective of the meeting was to discussion collaboration between IPH Lahore and WHO Pakistan. Main areas of collaboration included; laboratory strengthening especially SARI and ILI, support to short course on Vector Control, NCDs and Mental Health, technical support to move forward on IPH as WHO collaboration centre and capacity development for IPH Lahore to become a centre for disease control.

The objective of the training is to build capacities of the Obstetricians and Gynaecologists in the management of COVID-19 in pregnancy.






## COVID-19 confirmed cases & CFR (%) by districts
