


SITUATION REPORT COVID-19 PAKISTAN




Executive Summary

Pakistan reported **626** new cases of COVID-19 on **13 August 2020**. The total number of cases notified since the beginning of the outbreak is **287,300** with **6,153** deaths **(CFR: 2.14%)**. Out of the total **15,932** currently active cases, **1,333** cases are hospitalized, out of which **774 (58.06%)** are in critical condition. **14,599** COVID-19 positive cases are at designated isolation facilities or inhome isolation. A total of **265,215 (92.31%)** have recovered and discharged.

Daily Mortality in Pakistan





Maintaining Essential Health Services in Pakistan


WHO and UNFPA have entered into a joint partnership worth US \$ 264,600. The interventions under this partnership will focus on GBV prevention, improving facility based readiness and service provision to GBV survivors, Pre-service and in-service capacity building of health care providers and community health workers on provision of clinical management, psycho-social support and referral of survivors as well as development of multi-sectoral referral pathways

These interventions are relevant to the current context of COVID-19 outbreak and address the intersections of gender/GBV and COVID-19. The interventions will be implemented in the provinces of Punjab and KP over the period of 6 months.

Coordination & Meetings

On the 10th August 2020, WHO Pakistan Incident Manager Dr. Michael Lukwiya participating in a Core Groups virtual meeting for Public Health Surveillance and Response System The meeting was organized by the planning commission. Participants in the meeting included WHO, NIH, Planning commission and the representatives from the provinces. The objective of the meeting was to develop strategy to further strengthen disease surveillance with specific focus on SARI/ILI.




