



Pakistan reported **2,417** new cases of COVID-19 on **14 January 2021**. The total number of cases notified since the beginning of the outbreak is **514,338** with **10,863** deaths **(CFR: 2.11%)**. Out of the total **34,169** currently active cases **2,794** cases are hospitalized.

#### **MEETINGS & COORDINATION**

On 14<sup>th</sup> January 2021, WHO Country Representative Pakistan Dr Palitha Mahipala visited Leprosy Hospital Rawalpindi and met with the Director of the Hospital, Dr. Chris Schmotzer. Dr Chris briefed WR on the historical background of the Leprosy hospital and services being provided there. She also briefed the WR about the current situation of Leprosy and the major challenges faced to control the disease in Pakistan. Dr. Chris acknowledge WHO Pakistan effort in providing immense support to the hospital specifically in the provision of medicine, guidelines, trainings, advocacy and Active Case Findings. She also appreciated the WHO support of medicine for leishmaniasis patients.

Dr. Palitha prized the efforts of the Aid to Leprosy Patient (ALP) team for providing quality care to patients and reaffirmed WHO continued commitment to the hospital management in capacity building of ALP team and the provision of equipment and medical supplies. WR promised to provide 500 Glucantime injections to the hospital immediately.
