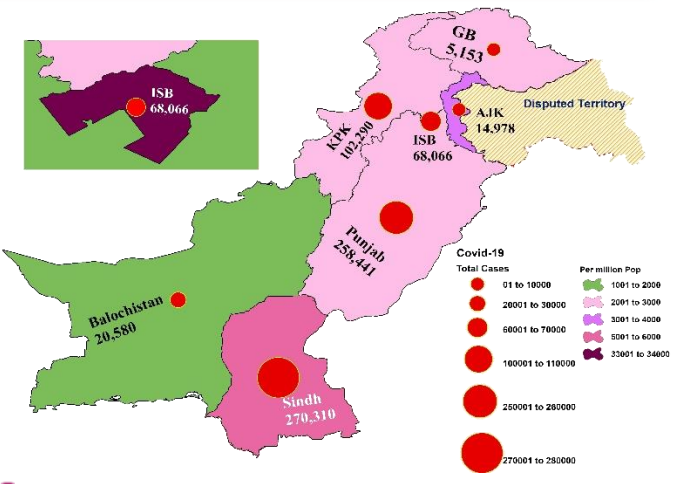

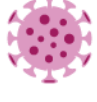

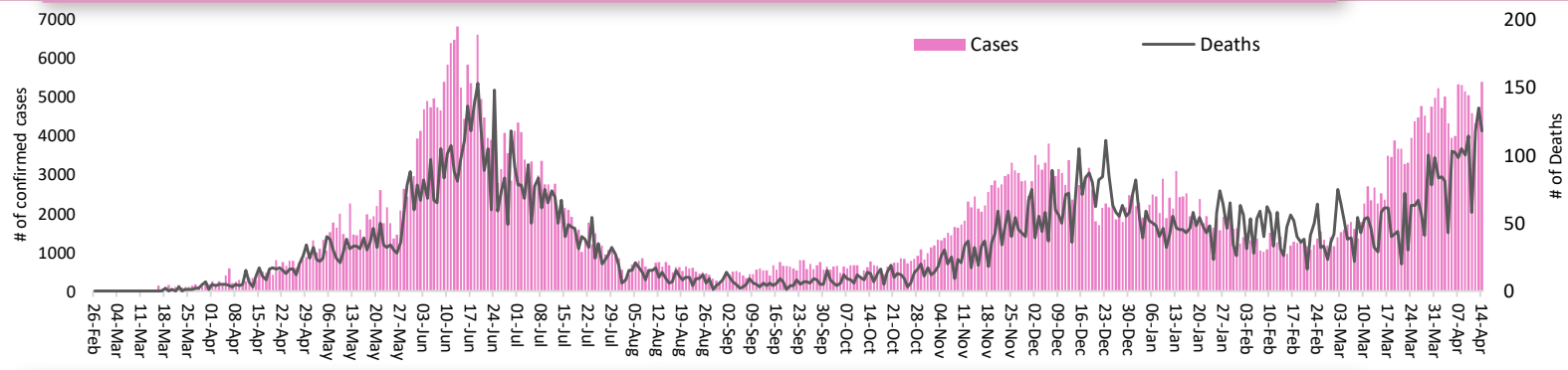

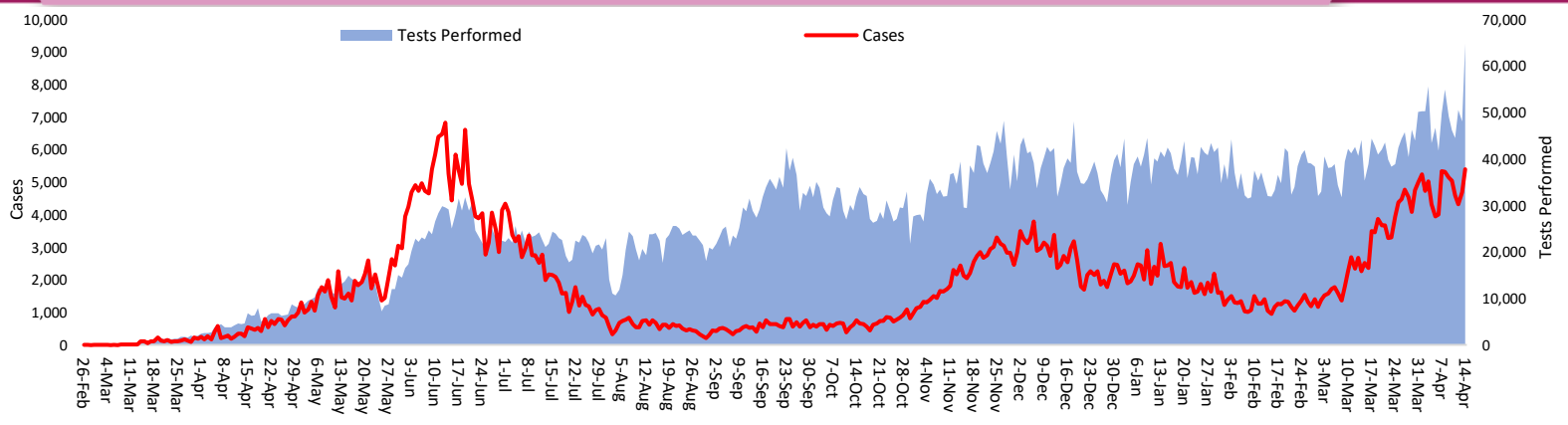

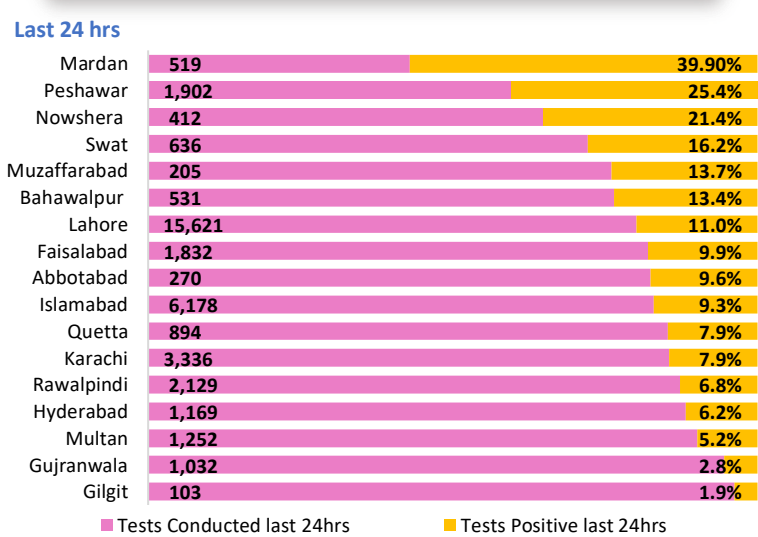
MEETING AND COORDINATION



Dr Palitha Mahipala, WHO Country Representative in Pakistan, expressed his deepest appreciation of the government's decision to commemorate the "National Quit Day". In his statement issued today, Dr Palitha congratulated Dr Faisal Sultan, Special Assistant to Prime Minister on Health, for declaring the first day of Ramazan as the "National Quit Day". He said it is high time for people of this great nation to encourage smokers in their homes, workplaces, and communities to quit smoking. "The holy month of Ramazan is a real opportunity to quit smoking".

Dr Palitha stated that if Pakistan continues with the current momentum, it will be the only country in the region that would achieve the target of reducing tobacco use by 30 % by the year 2025. He warned that smokers are more vulnerable to Covid-19, therefore they should really commit to quit in line with the theme of the upcoming World No Tobacco Day.
