On 15<sup>th</sup> October 2021, Ministry of National Health Services Regulations & Coordination in collaboration with National Institute of Health and World Health Organization Pakistan conducted the 1<sup>st</sup> meeting of the National IPC steering committee. The objectives of the meeting were to review National IPC strategic framework, IPC implementation as per AMR NAP 2017 & COVID context, and endorsement of health workers' training curriculum for IPC. Special Assistant to Prime Minister for Health Dr. Faisal Sultan and WHO Country Representative Pakistan Dr. Palitha Mahipala attended the closing session. During his speech, Dr Palitha emphasized on the importance of IPC curriculum in building capacity of health workers and defining monitoring indicators for HCW. He reaffirmed WHO commitment to strengthening IPC. Dr. Faisal stated that COVID-19 has drawn major attention to IPC and called for the need for consistent IPC advocacy and use of scientific based IPC practices. He concluded by saying that the regulators play an important part in IPC implementation.
