





TOTAL CASES & CASES PER MILLION POP.




Pakistan reported **2,128** new cases of COVID-19 on **15 November 2020**. The total number of cases notified since the beginning of the outbreak is **359,032** with **7,160** deaths **(CFR: 1.99%).** Out of the total **28,048** currently active cases, **1,587** cases are hospitalized.

MEETINGS & COORDINATION

WHO Pakistan in collaboration with provincial health department Sindh conducted the first 3 days short course for master trainers on the integration of noncommunicable diseases (NCDs) at primary health care. The course was conducted from 12-14 November 2020 in Karachi. Twenty (20) doctors from PHC level in the two model districts of Larkana and Hyderabad participated.

Dr Palitha Mahipala, WHO Country Representative Pakistan, set the pace with his presentation on the integration of NCDs at PHC level. He briefed the participants on the burden of NCDs globally and in Pakistan. He highlighted that NCDs contributes to high mortality. He further stated that one dollar invested in the prevention of NCDs would save around seven dollars. He concluded his presentation by highlighting the importance of implementing the WHO Best Buys for the prevention of NCDs risk factors which included use of tobacco, inactivity, unhealthy diet and use of alcohol
