



## **INCIDENCE & DEATHS BY DATE**




TOTAL CASES & CASES PER MILLION POP.



Pakistan reported **2,050** new cases of COVID-19 on **16 November 2020**. The total number of cases notified since the beginning of the outbreak is **361,082** with **7,193** deaths **(CFR: 1.99%).** Out of the total **29,055** currently active cases, **1,688** cases are hospitalized.



## SUMMARY TABLE BY PROVINCE

### **MEETINGS & COORDINATION**

Yesterday, 16th November 2020, World Health Organization Pakistan in collaboration with the Women's Parliamentary Caucus (WPC) conducted a breast cancer awareness session in Lahore. This event is part of a nationwide advocacy campaign to promote early detection of breast cancer.

While speaking at the occasion, the WHO Country Representative in Pakistan, Dr Palitha Mahipala, stated that "breast cancer is the second leading cause of death among women in Pakistan. It is therefore important that women learn to conduct self-examination and seek early medical assistance to improve the outcome of this disease". WHO strongly recommends that women learn self-diagnosis in order to detect early signs of breast cancer. The WR further affirmed that WHO is fully committed to supporting the Ministry of National Health Services Regulation and Coordination in Pakistan to prevent breast cancer.
