

COVID-19 case density/million Population




Executive Summary

Pakistan reported **617** new cases of COVID-19 on **17 August 2020**. The total number of cases notified since the beginning of the outbreak is **289,832** with **6,190** deaths (CFR: **2.13%**). Out of the total **13,633** currently active cases, **1,275** cases are hospitalized, out of which **759** (**58.52%**) are in critical condition. **12,358** COVID-19 positive cases are at designated isolation facilities or in-home isolation. A total of **270,009** (**93.16%**) have recovered and discharged.


Daily Lab tests conducted in Pakistan

12-May to 17-Aug 2020




Daily incidence of COVID-19 cases in Pakistan




Coordination & Meetings








COVID-19 confirmed cases & CFR (%) by districts
