


# SITUATION REPORT COVID-19 PAKISTAN







Pakistan reported **440** new cases of COVID-19 on **18 October 2020**. The total number of cases notified since the beginning of the outbreak is **323,452** with **6,659** deaths (CFR: **2.06%)**. Out of the total **9,384** currently active cases, **789** cases are hospitalized, out of which **526 (66.67%)** are in critical condition. **8,595** COVID-19 positive cases are at designated isolation facilities or inhome isolation. A total of **307,409 (95.04%)** have recovered and discharged.




Daily COVID-19 Positivity Rate




(Last 24hrs) COVID-19 Positivity rates by Province

## **Meetings & Coordination**

Today, 19<sup>th</sup> October 2020, The WHO Country Representative Pakistan, Dr Palitha Mahipala donated emergency supplies, worth 527,073 USD for floods response to Sindh province. The donation was handed over to the Chairman, National Disaster Management Authority (NDMA) Lt. Gen Muhammad Afzal.

The donation included 300 Blankets, 5000 mosquito nets, multipurpose tents and RT-PCR Kits (1000 kits of 50 tests each).

The chairman NDMA expressed his gratitude to WHO for the continued support it is rendering to Pakistan in various situations including the COVID-19 and the floods response.
