

SITUATION REPORT OVID-19 PAKISTAN









Pakistan reported 625 new cases of COVID-19 on 19 October 2020. The total number of cases notified since the beginning of the outbreak is 324,084 with 6,673 deaths (CFR: 2.06%). Out of the total 9,461 currently active cases, 805 cases are hospitalized, out of which 544 (67.58%) are in critical condition. 8,656 COVID-19 positive cases are at designated isolation facilities or inhome isolation. A total of 307,950 (95.02%) have recovered and discharged.



Daily COVID-19 Positivity Rate




COVID-19 Positivity rates by Province (Last 24hrs)
