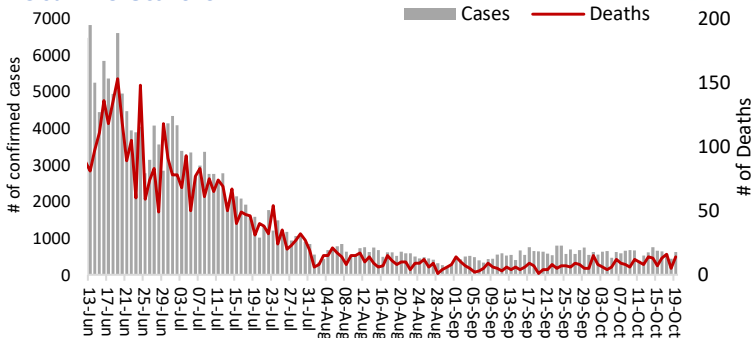

Executive Summary

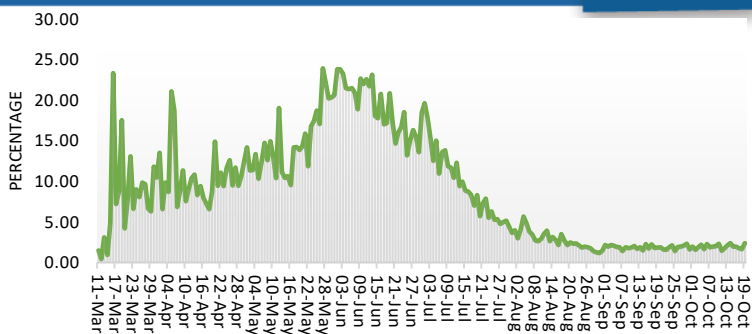
Pakistan reported **625** new cases of COVID-19 on **19 October 2020**. The total number of cases notified since the beginning of the outbreak is **324,084** with **6,673** deaths (**CFR: 2.06%**). Out of the total **9,461** currently active cases, **805** cases are hospitalized, out of which **544 (67.58%)** are in critical condition. **8,656** COVID-19 positive cases are at designated isolation facilities or in-home isolation. A total of **307,950 (95.02%)** have recovered and discharged.

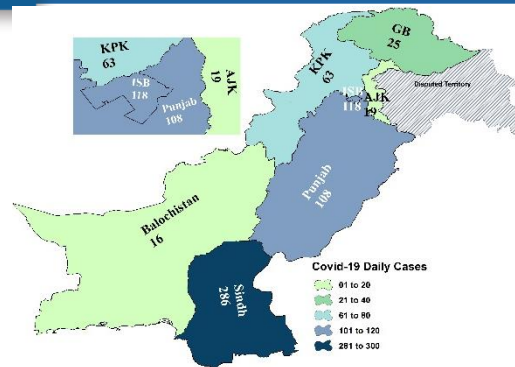

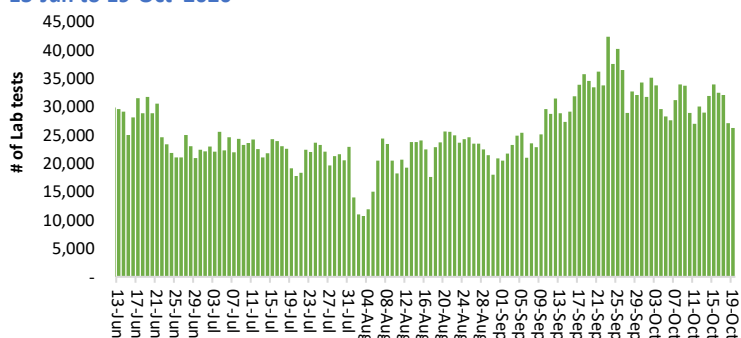

Daily Incidence by Province



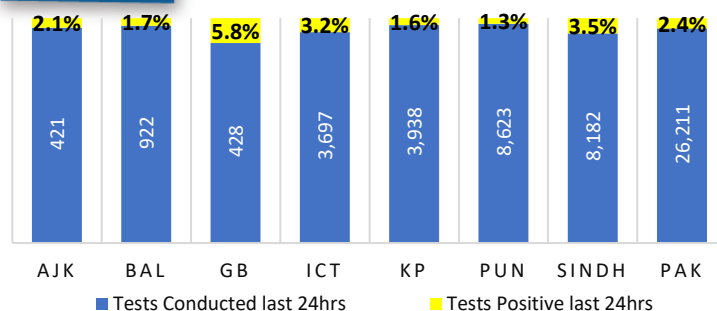

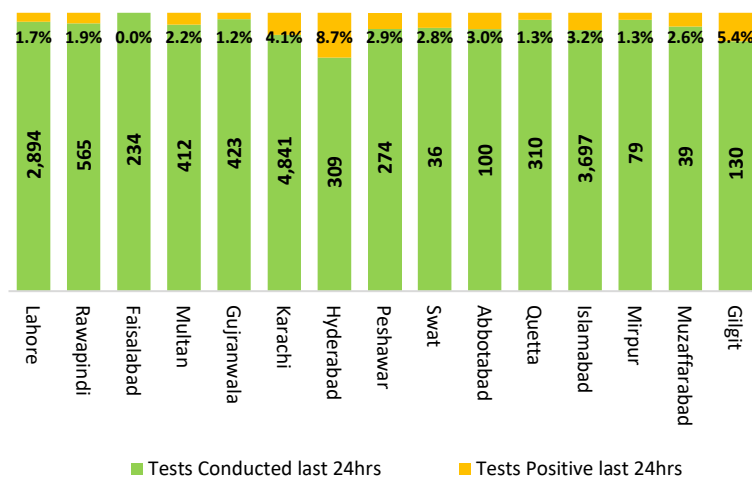
