





TOTAL CASES & CASES PER MILLION POP.




Pakistan reported 2,738 new cases of COVID-19 on 19 November 2020. The total number of cases notified since the beginning of the outbreak is 368,665 with 7,561 deaths (CFR: 2.05%). Out of the total 33,562 currently active cases, 2,018 cases are hospitalized.

MEETINGS & COORDINATION

Today, 20th November 2020, The United Nations Infection Prevention Committee Technical Working Group (UN IPC TWG) virtual meeting was conducted. The meeting was chaired by the WHO Country Representative Dr Palitha Mahipala and attended by UNICEF Representative Aida Girma-Melaku, UNFPA Representative Lina Mousa among other. The Objective of the meeting was to review the current situation of IPC response, gaps and the way forward. WHO Country representative informed the meeting that WHO has identified 14 hospitals as model hospitals for IPC implementation in Pakistan. In addition, WHO has contracted additional 15 surveillance officers to be deployed at division level. The surveillance officers will be responsible for supporting surveillance, laboratory and IPC in the 15 high risk districts. UNICEF and UNFPA informed the meeting that they are supporting WASH/IPC, training, provision of supplies and risk communication at the district and community level.

The meeting recommendations included mapping of HCFs providing COVID case management and identification of priority areas of collective support for IPC implementation.
