

#### **Executive Summary**

Pakistan reported **513** new cases of COVID-19 on **19 August 2020**. The total number of cases notified since the beginning of the outbreak is **290,958** with **6,209** deaths **(CFR: 2.13%)**. Out of the total **11,945** currently active cases, **1,216** cases are hospitalized, out of which **725 (59.62%)** are in critical condition. **10,729** COVID-19 positive cases are at designated isolation facilities or inhome isolation. A total of **272,804 (93.76%)** have recovered and discharged.

#### Daily incidence of COVID-19 cases in Pakistan




#### COVID-19 case density/million Population

### **Daily Mortality in Pakistan**








#### **Coordination & Meetings**

Today, August 19th, 2020 the WHO country representative, Pakistan Dr Palitha Mahipala made a call to Qatar embassy, Diplomatic enclave Islamabad and met with the Ambassador H.E Sheikh Saoud Abdulrahman Al-Thani in view of mobilizing resource for response to COVID-19.

During the meeting, the WR updated the Ambassador on the current situation of COVID-19 in the country especially the remarkable response by the government of Pakistan which led to a steep decline in the daily incidence of COVID-19.





#### **Maintaining Essential Health Services in Pakistan**

Today 20<sup>th</sup> August 2020 the World Health Organization Pakistan and Punjab hepatitis prevention and control program conducted a meeting to develop the Provincial Hepatitis strategy and plan for the continuity of care during the COVID-19 Pandemic. This plan is in line with the Punjab Hepatitis Control Program and WHO Micro elimination project for Hepatis in one UC (Panawan) in the district of Nankana sahib of Punjab province.






## COVID-19 confirmed cases & CFR (%) by districts
