

Executive Summary

Pakistan reported **630** new cases of COVID-19 on **20** August **2020**. The total number of cases notified since the beginning of the outbreak is **291,588** with **6,219** deaths (CFR: **2.13%**). Out of the total **11,790** currently active cases, **1,271** cases are hospitalized, out of which **722** (**56.80%**) are in critical condition. **10,519** COVID-19 positive cases are at designated isolation facilities or inhome isolation. A total of **273,579** (**93.82%**) have recovered and discharged.

Daily incidence of COVID-19 cases in Pakistan




COVID-19 case density/million Population

Daily Mortality in Pakistan








Coordination & Meetings

World Health Organization Pakistan in collaboration with Department of Education, Balochistan conducted training off thirty Head of institutes, Senior Teachers and Administrative staff on COVID-19 on 20th August 2020.

The objective of the training was to orientate the above participants on COVID-19 SOPs before opening schools. Topics covered included facts on COVID-19, handwashing, use of masks during school time and physical distancing. This training was requested by the Provincial Department of Education, Balochistan.





Maintaining Essential Health Services in Pakistan

In March 2020, World Health Organization Pakistan in collaboration with Department of Health Khyber Pakhtunkhwa conducted an initial assessment of IPC at selected health facilities to identify gaps. As a result of the identified gaps, 1,456 healthcare workers were trained on IPC and provided with IEC materials, disinfectants, soap and PPE's.


A follow up assessment in July revealed significant improvement. For instance, relevant SOP's were available and implemented in most of the key facilities, triage was being conducted, isolation areas for COVID-19 patients were designated and standard droplet precautions were in place. The IPC committees of the respective facilities were more empowered. The infection rate among the Health care workers significantly dropped






COVID-19 confirmed cases & CFR (%) by districts
