



INCIDENCE & DEATHS BY DATE




TOTAL CASES & CASES PER MILLION POP.




Pakistan reported **1,927** new cases of COVID-19 on **22 January 2021**. The total number of cases notified since the beginning of the outbreak is **530,818** with **11,247** deaths **(CFR: 2.12%)**. Out of the total **35,063** currently active cases **2,789** cases are hospitalized.

On 21st January 2021, World Health Organization Pakistan in collaboration with Provincial Health Department Sindh, conducted an orientation session for the district surveillance teams on surveillance of notifiable diseases and SARI/ILI sentinel surveillance.
