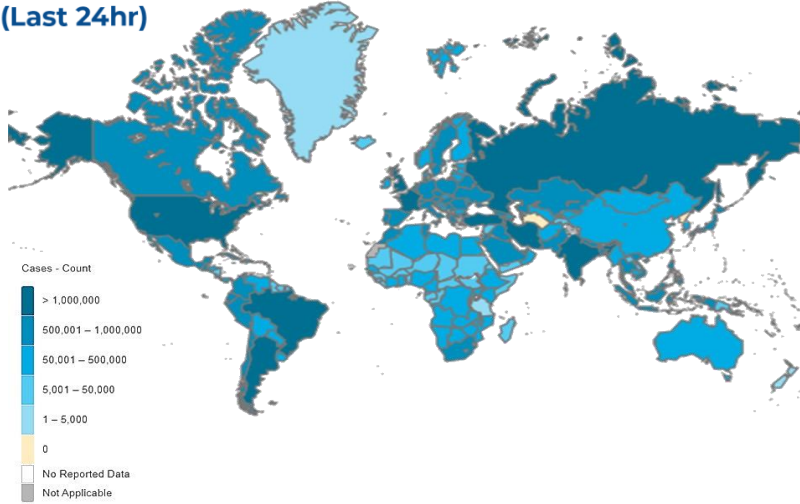
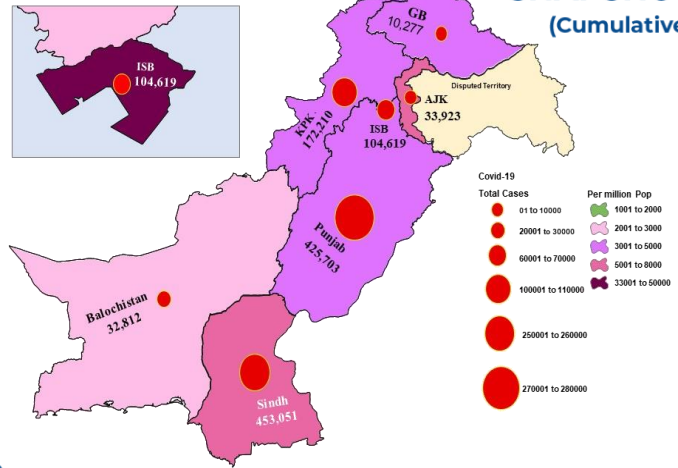

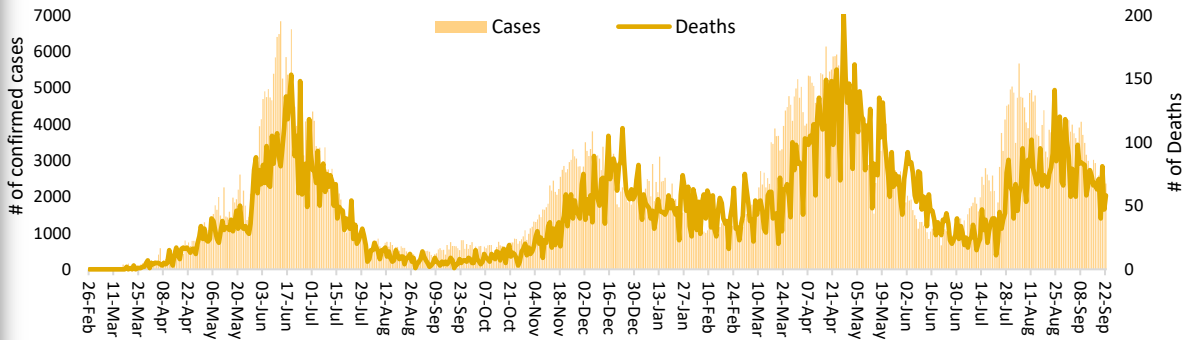

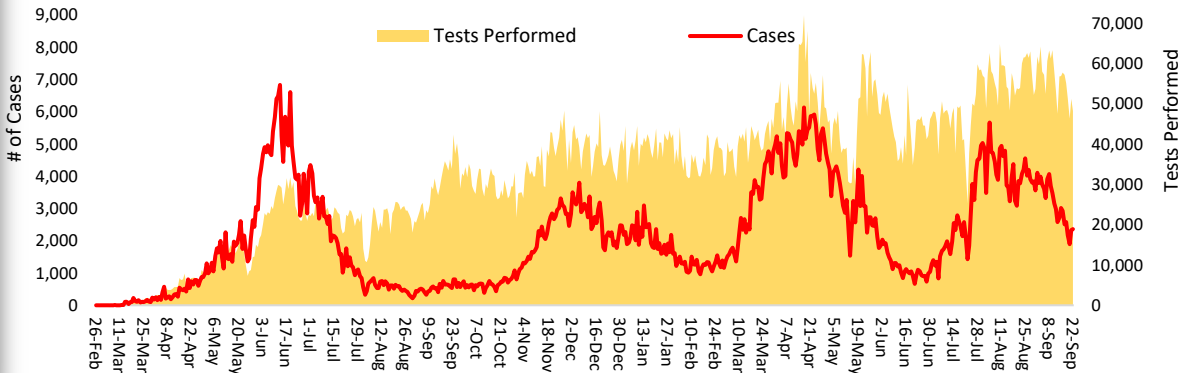

On 22nd September 2021, WHO Country Representative Pakistan, Dr Palitha Mahipala paid a courtesy call to the Honorable Chairman of the Senate of Pakistan, Muhammad Sadiq Sanjrani. Dr Palitha was accompanied by Dr Maryam Mallick, WHO Technical Advisor on disability.

The two discuss the ways to strengthen national capacity and multisectoral action and partnerships to accelerate Pakistan response for the prevention and control of non-communicable diseases. During the meeting, Dr Palitha emphasized on formation of Non-Communicable Diseases (NCDs) Committee in Senate to advocate and recommend policies and programs for the prevention and control of NCDs.

The WR highlighted the WHO's goal to reduce the major risk factors of NCDs; tobacco use, unhealthy diet, physical inactivity among others. He also underscored the significance of taxation on cigarettes and the pictorial representation.

Chairman Senate appreciated WHO role in the prevention and control of Non-communicable disease in the country.
