


SITUATION REPORT COVID-19 PAKISTAN




Executive Summary

Pakistan reported **496** new cases of COVID-19 on **23 August 2020**. The total number of cases notified since the beginning of the outbreak is **293,261** with **6,244** deaths (CFR: **2.12%)**. Out of the total **10,188** currently active cases, **1,163** cases are hospitalized, out of which **686** (**58.98%**) are in critical condition. **9,025** COVID-19 positive cases are at designated isolation facilities or in-home isolation. A total of **276,829** (**94.39%**) have recovered and discharged.






Daily Incidence by Province


Daily Lab test conducted in Pakistan




Daily Attact rate/million Population





COVID-19 Positivity rates in major cities/districts




