

SITUATION REPORT OVID-19 PAKISTAN







Pakistan reported 799 new cases of COVID-19 on 23 September 2020. The total number of cases notified since the beginning of the outbreak is 308,217 with 6,437 deaths (CFR: 2.09%). Out of the total 7,388 currently active cases, 872 cases are hospitalized, out of which 548 (62.84%) are in critical condition. 6,516 COVID-19 positive cases are at designated isolation facilities or in-home isolation. A total of 294,392 (95.51%) have recovered and discharged.



WR Pakistan visited Rural Health Center, Mandara




Today, 24th September 2020, WHO country representative, Pakistan Dr Palitha Mahipala along with Coordinator, Polio eradication programme, Dr Zainul Abedin and Deputy Team lead Polio, Dr Ibrahim Yalahow visited Rural Health Centre, Mandra and Trauma Centre at Tehsil Headquarter Hospital, Gujar Khan in district Rawalpindi. The objective of the visit was to monitor Supplementary Immunization Activities (SIAs) for Polio. During the visit, WR appreciated the efforts of the district in improving immunization coverage and advised health workers on maintaining SOPs for COVID-19 during the Polio campaign. In response, the heads of the facilities visited, applauded WHO support to the government in controlling the outbreak of COVID-19.
