









INCIDENCE & DEATHS BY DATE




TOTAL CASES & CASES PER MILLION POP.



Pakistan reported 2,152 new cases of COVID-19 on 24 December 2020. The total number of cases notified since the beginning of the outbreak is 467,222 with 9,753 deaths (CFR: 2.09%). Out of the total 38,511 currently active cases 2,886 cases are hospitalized.

MEETINGS & COORDINATION

On 24th December 2020 WHO Country Representative, Pakistan Dr Palitha Mahipala chaired the concluding session of community pharmacists' training in Islamabad. The training was conducted by the District Health Office Islamabad and National TB Control program with the collaboration of WHO Pakistan as part of TB Free Islamabad initiative.

WR noted in his concluding remarks "Pharmacists are key stakeholders of the health system. TB free initiative recognizes the central role of the pharmacists for ending TB. Mandatory TB notification and reporting sales of TB medicines by pharmacies is a landmark achievement. This is going to be the game changer for ending TB in Islamabad Capital Territory (ICT) as well as throughout Pakistan". Dr Nasim Akhtar, Deputy National Coordinator (TB), Ministry of NHSR&C, Dr Najeeb Durrani, District TB Coordinator ICT and Mr Sardar Shabbir Senior Drug Inspector, ICT also addressed at the occasion.
