

Executive Summary

Pakistan reported 1,487 new cases of COVID-19 on 24 July 2020. The total number of cases notified since the beginning of the outbreak is 271,887 with 5,787 deaths (CFR: 2.12%). Out of the total 29,504 currently active cases, 2,287 cases are hospitalized, out of which 1,294 (56.58%) are in critical condition. 27,217 COVID-19 positive cases are at designated isolation facilities or inhome isolation. A total of 236,596 (87.01%) have recovered and discharged.

Daily incidence of COVID-19 cases in Pakistan






COVID-19 case density/million Population




Meeting & Coordination




Daily Positivity rate in Pakistan

Trends of COVID-19 cases, hospitalized, on ventilator & Deaths




