



#### **Executive Summary**


Pakistan reported 450 new cases of COVID-19 on 24 August 2020. The total number of cases notified since the beginning of the outbreak is 293,711 with 6,255 deaths (CFR: 2.13%). Out of the total 9,031 currently active cases, 1,128 cases are hospitalized, out of which 672 (59.57%) are in critical condition. 7,903 COVID-19 positive cases are at designated isolation facilities or in-home isolation. A total of 278,425 (94.79%) have recovered and discharged.





#### **Daily Incidence by Province**







**COVID-19** Positivity rates


