


SITUATION REPORT






Pakistan reported **798** new cases of COVID-19 on **24 September 2020**. The total number of cases notified since the beginning of the outbreak is **309,015** with **6,444** deaths (CFR: 2.09%). Out of the total **7,831** currently active cases, **933** cases are hospitalized, out of which **544** (**58.31%**) are in critical condition. **6,898** COVID-19 positive cases are at designated isolation facilities or in-home isolation. A total of **294,740** (**95.38%**) have recovered and discharged.




Daily COVID-19 Positivity Rate





Maintaining Essential Health Services

The WHO Pakistan in collaboration with Provincial department of health, Punjab and Society of Obstetrics & Gynaecologists (SOGP) conducted a 4 days Training of Trainers (TOT) for gynaecologists on Health System Response to Gender based Violence in the context of COVID-19.

The training was conducted from 21-24 September 2020 in Lahore. The objective of the training was to strengthen provision of health care for survivors of GBV during COVID-19 pandemic. 18 senior health professionals from 10 health facilities of Punjab were trained. Topics cover covered included Sexual and Reproductive Health and right (SRHR) in the context of COVID-19. Ms. Ayesha Iqbal member of provincial parliament Punjab during her speech to the participants applauded WHO support to the government in controlling the outbreak of COVID-19 in the country.
