

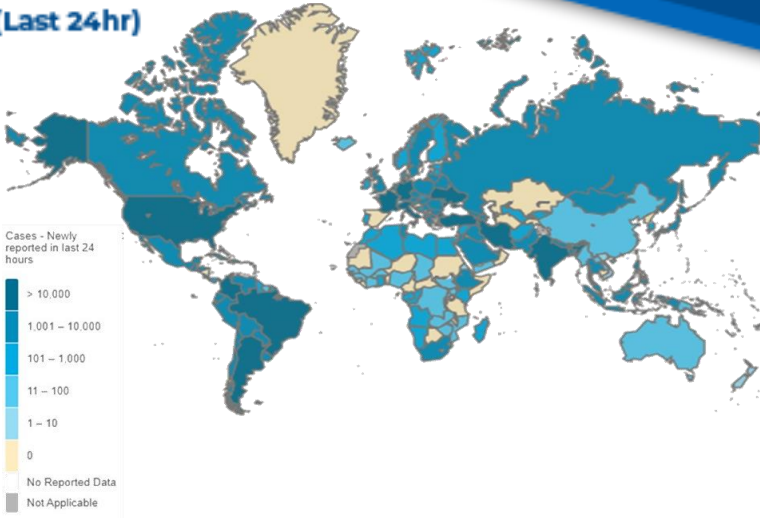

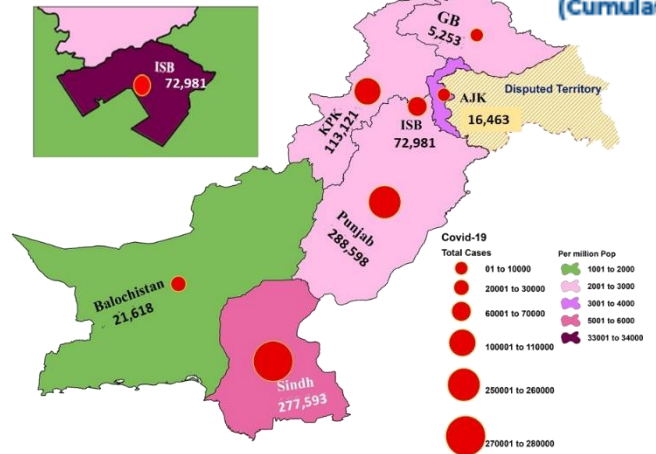

PAKISTAN COVID-19 SNAPSHOT (Cumulative)

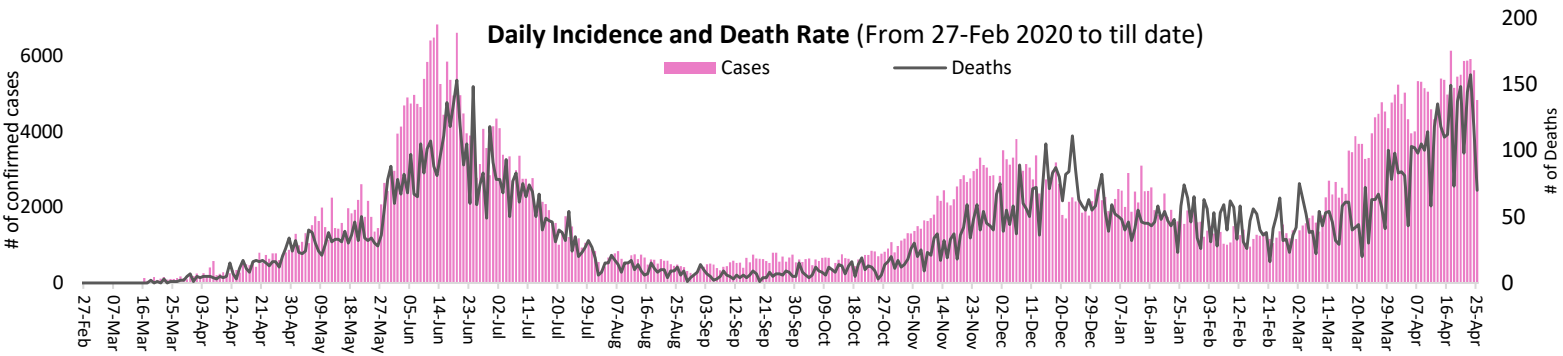

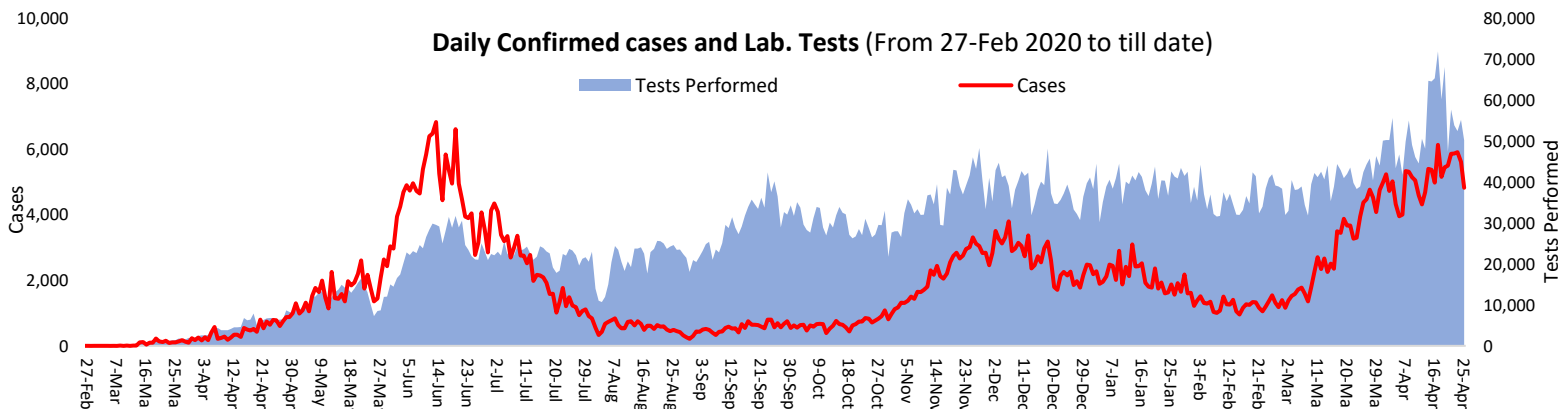

On 26th April 2021, World Health Organization, Pakistan commemorated The Global World Malaria Day at WHO country office Islamabad, Pakistan. 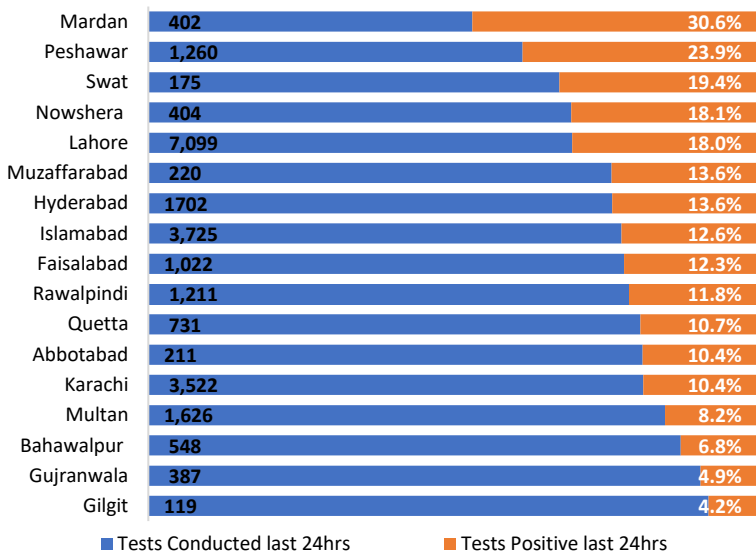
