



Executive Summary


Pakistan reported **482** new cases of COVID-19 on **25 August 2020**. The total number of cases notified since the beginning of the outbreak is **294,193** with **6,267** deaths **(CFR: 2.13%)**. Out of the total **8,987** currently active cases, **1,097** cases are hospitalized, out of which **669 (60.98%)** are in critical condition. **7,890** COVID-19 positive cases are at designated isolation facilities or in-home isolation. A total of **278,939 (94.81%)** have recovered and discharged.

Daily Incidence/Mortality




Daily COVID-19 Global Updates (Last 24hrs)



Daily Incidence by Province





Daily Positivity Rate




Maintaining Essential Health Services

WHO country representative, Pakistan Dr Palitha Mahipala attended the closing ceremony of the Global Laboratory Leadership Program (GLLP) phase 2, which has been accomplished under the stern challenges posed by the ongoing COVID19 pandemic. WHO EMRO and HQ laboratory teams also participated along with representatives from the US CDC.

Pakistan is the first country where the full GLLP program is being validated using a phased approach. Phase 2 was implemented using virtual training tools, between June and September 2020, covering three modules on lab quality, research and management. During his closing remarks, Dr Palitha highlighted the role of strong laboratory leaders to build, strengthen and sustain national laboratory systems in the country.

Meeting & Coordination



Daily Attack Rate/Million Population






COVID-19 Confirmed cases & CFR by Major Cities / Districts Last 24 hrs 160
