

# SITUATION REPORT OVID-19 PAKISTAN






Pakistan reported 566 new cases of COVID-19 on 26 September 2020. The total number of cases notified since the beginning of the outbreak is 310,275 with 6,457 deaths (CFR: 2.08%). Out of the total 8,205 currently active cases, 924 cases are hospitalized, out of which 584 (63.20%) are in critical condition. 7,281 COVID-19 positive cases are at designated isolation facilities or in-home isolation. A total of 295,613 (95.27%) have recovered and discharged.




**Daily COVID-19 Positivity Rate** 






COVID-19 Positivity rates by Province (Last 24hrs)

## Capacity building of the laboratoriesn

In response to the request by the Health Department, Government of Balochistan, the WHO Country Office Pakistan, in collaboration with the National Institute of Health, Islamabad visited public health laboratory at Fatima Jinnah Chest and General Hospital, Quetta and Sheikh Khalifa bin Zayyed Federal Hospital Quetta on  $26^{th} - 27^{th}$ September 2020. The objective of visit to is to provide onsite technical support and capacity building of the provincial public health laboratory staff.

The team will also conduct a detailed lab assessment in two districts of Balochistan at district Khuzdar and Loralai. The purpose of the assessment is to evaluate the current capacity and quality of COVID-19 testing Laboratories in district Khuzdar and loralai.
