

#### **Executive Summary**


Pakistan reported **415** new cases of COVID-19 on **27 August 2020**. The total number of cases notified since the beginning of the outbreak is **295,053** with **6,283** deaths **(CFR: 2.13%)**. Out of the total **8,833** currently active cases, **1,083** cases are hospitalized, out of which **644 (59.46%)** are in critical condition. **7,750** COVID-19 positive cases are at designated isolation facilities or in-home isolation. A total of **279,937 (94.87%)** have recovered and discharged.

#### **Daily Incidence/Mortality**




## **Daily COVID-19 Global Updates** (Last 24hrs)



#### **Daily Incidence by Province**







#### **Daily Attack Rate/Million Population**





## **COVID-19 Confirmed cases & CFR** by Major Cities / Districts




#### **Occupied COVID-19 ventilators**
