

Executive Summary

Pakistan reported **1,063** new cases of COVID-19 on **28** July **2020**. The total number of cases notified since the beginning of the outbreak is **276,288** with **5,892** deaths (CFR: **2.13%**). Out of the total **25,213** currently active cases, **1,879** cases are hospitalized, out of which **1,179** (**62.74%**) are in critical condition. **23,634** COVID-19 positive cases are at designated isolation facilities or inhome isolation. A total of **244,883** (**88.63%**) have recovered and discharged.

Daily incidence of COVID-19 cases in Pakistan






COVID-19 case density/million Population

Daily Mortality in Pakistan








Meeting & Coordination



Trends of COVID-19 cases, hospitalized, on ventilator & Deaths






