

#### **Executive Summary**

Pakistan reported 319 new cases of COVID-19 on 28 August 2020. The total number of cases notified since the beginning of the outbreak is 295,372 with 6,284 deaths (CFR: 2.12%). Out of the total 8,748 currently active cases, 1,084 cases are hospitalized, out of which 642 (59.22%) are in critical condition. 7,664 COVID-19 positive cases are at designated isolation facilities or in-home isolation. A total of 280,340 (94.91%) have recovered and discharged.





#### Daily Incidence by Province





Twelve days outreach activities started in all 33 districts of Balochistan from 21<sup>st</sup> August 2020.



#### Daily Attack Rate/Million Population





## **COVID-19 Confirmed cases & CFR** by Major Cities / Districts




#### Occupied COVID-19 ventilators
