






INCIDENCE & DEATHS BY DATE




TOTAL CASES & CASES PER MILLION POP.



Pakistan reported 2,179 new cases of COVID-19 on 29 January 2021. The total number of cases notified since the beginning of the outbreak is 543,214 with 11,623 deaths (CFR: 2.14%). Out of the total 33,439 currently active cases 2,566 cases are hospitalized.

SUMMARY TABLE BY PROVINCE

MEETINGS & COORDINATION

The World Health Organization, Pakistan in collaboration with Provincial Health Department Balochistan conducted Training of Health Care Providers on COVID-19 case management and Infection prevention and control (IPC). The objectives of the training were to train health care professional on clinical management of mild, moderate or severe COVID-19 patients according to the latest case management guidelines and implementation of IPC measures in hospital settings. Six consecutive training sessions were conducted from 22 to 28 January 2021 at six Tertiary care hospital in Quetta. A total of 180 health professionals from 6 hospitals in Quetta including, Shaheed Benazir Bhutto Hospital, Mufti Mehmood Hospital Kuchluk, Fatima Jinnah General and Chest Hospital, Sheikh Khalifa Bin Zayed Hospital, Bolan Medical Complex Hospital, Sandman Provincial / Civil Hospital, were trained. The training participants mainly comprised of Clinicians, Resident Medical Officers, doctors, nurses, and paramedics involved in COVID-19 case management.
