

## **Executive Summary**


Pakistan reported 264 new cases of COVID-19 on 29 August 2020. The total number of cases notified since the beginning of the outbreak is 295,636 with 6,288 deaths (CFR: 2.12%). Out of the total 8,801 currently active cases, 1,046 cases are hospitalized, out of which 601 (57.45%) are in critical condition. 7,755 COVID-19 positive cases are at designated isolation facilities or in-home isolation. A total of 280,547 (94.89%) have recovered and discharged.

# Daily Incidence/Mortality












# Occupied COVID-19 ventilators
