### WHO RESPONSE

WHO oPt's response includes delivery of **medicine and medical supplies** to Al-Makassed Hospital and the Palestine Red Crescent Society (PRCS), for the immediate **treatment of trauma victims** and to **replenish medical stocks** to ensure preparedness and response for future needs



**Rapid needs assessment** conducted with Al-Makassed and PRCS



**\$158,000 Utilised** by WHO to procure emergency medical supplies



**\$1,000,000 Pipeline** value of equipment and emergency medical supplies under procurement



**11,000 People** suffering from trauma and injuries can be treated through WHO-provided supplies



**44 health workers** trained on mass casualty management (MCM). Since January 2022, WHO has trained 148 health workers on MCM

- Monitor and document attacks against health care
