HIGHLIGHTS

• Cities with highest new infections: Jeddah (393), Dammam (301), Riyadh (299), Makkah (277), Qatif (237), Khobar (178), Dhahran (165) and Madinah (156).

• Number of pilgrims will not exceed 10,000, pilgrims should be less than 65 years of age and not suffering from any chronic diseases; They will be checked before preforming the rituals.

• Medical teams will accompany pilgrims; social distancing will be implemented; pilgrims will be isolated after completing Hajj.

• No return of residents to Saudi Arabia until the end of the pandemic, and in accordance with a valid entry visa.

• Ministry of Health website monitors all coronavirus

information and publications being posted on all social media platforms.

• WHO updates criteria for releasing patients from isolation (see link below).

• WHO releases "WHO Academy" mobile application providing COVID-19 resources for health workers in 6 UN languages.

• WHO clarifies comments made earlier regarding COVID-19


