

Highlights:

- ❖ 2 AFP cases were detected in Sweida and Aleppo.
- ❖ A slight decrease in number of AJS cases was noticed this week
- ❖ a slight increase in number of SARI cases was noticed this week.

Completeness& Timeliness of Reporting


❖ The overall completeness of reporting was 71%; (461out of total 650 EWARS sentinel sites). (See Graph 1). 14 governorates have reported this week.



❖ Timeliness of reporting is 82%.


The Morbidity Cases

- ❖ Out of the 215,787 total consultations, a total of 16,749 cases were reported; of which 9,280 cases were Influenza like Illness (55%), 3,343cases were Acute Diarrhoea (20%), 899 cases of AJS, 206 cases of Sever Acute Respiratory Infection, 65 cases of Bloody Diarrhoea, 29 cases of Suspected Measles, 18 cases of Meningitis, and 2 AFP case.
- ❖ Below chart reflects the trend in the number of SARI cases in 2014 and 2015 in the period between week 38 2014 and week 8-2015.





❖ Graph 3displays the trend of the (29,200) AJS cases between wk23/2014-wk8/2015. The distribution of the cases per governorates shows that Idleb, DierEzor, and Damascus have the highest number of cases for this week. A slightly decrease in the number of cases was noticed for this week.



- ❖ In total, 2,907 cases were reported as "other diseases". The most important diseases reported within this group were: 394 cases of Leishmaniasis (most of which were reported from Hamah 41%, Idleb 14%, and Aleppo 13%), 182 cases of Typhoid (most of which were reported from DierEzor 43%, Rural Damascus 36%, and Idleb 16%), 61 cases of Brucellosis (most of which were reported from DierEzor 46%), 20 cases of TB and 2 cases of Pertussis.
- **❖** 53%of the cases were distributed among≥ 5 age group.
- ❖ ILI consists (58,27%) of the cases among <5 and (52,88%) among ≥ 5, while AD cases consists (22,25%) among <5 and (17,95%) among ≥ 5.
- Graphs 4 and 5 below show the proportional morbidity among < 5 and ≥ 5 year age groups respectively.

The cases were distributed equally among males and females.

The Response

AFP: Stool samples were collected from the AFP cases and sent to the reference lab in Damascus. The last national vaccination campaign was implemented during this week between 15th and 19th February.

AJS and water and food borne diseases: A health promotion campaign regarding food & water -borne diseases was launched last week and it is still carried out in all governorates throughout the country. The Awareness campaign about food and water borne diseases continues through the media (TV programmes, radio programmes, newspapers ...). The RRTs in all governorates continue conducting field visits to the IDPs shelters and schools to evaluate the health and environmental situation, and raise the awareness about food and water borne diseases.
