Dr Gezairy also emphasized the evolution of the IMCI strategy in the Region: "IMCI has evolved in our Region from the initial focus on survival to the more comprehensive one of health and development, in accordance with its original conceptual framework. This framework, in line with primary health care principles, emphasizes not only curative care but also preventive care and health promotion. This is, in fact, what IMCI is: primary child health care. IMCI is essential, integrated child care at primary health care level to address the main issues of children under five. It relies on scientifically sound methods, affordable technology and cost-effective interventions. It is flexible and dynamic in order to adapt and respond to different needs. It advocates for community leadership through its community component.
