


Myth




Myth

Fact



After receiving any COVID-19 vaccine, you can still donate blood or organs by following your health provider's advice. Many people with organ transplants have received the vaccine and not shown any complications.

Vaccinated people do not pose a danger to others because they have developed immunity against the virus through the vaccine. Current evidence shows that unvaccinated individuals are at higher risk of dying from COVID-19 than vaccinated people.

Claim



COVID-19 vaccines change and interact with human DNA.

Fact




COVID-19 vaccines don't change or interact with DNA. The mRNA vaccines deliver instructions to our cells to make a specific protein similar to the one that SARS-CoV-2 has. Our body then develops immunity against that protein to recognize and respond to future COVID-19 infections.











There are no microchips inside vaccines, and there is no way for injected vaccines to track individuals or gather information about them.









<p>Anyone who has received a COVID-19 vaccine must not take any type of anesthetics, even if it is a local anesthetic or anesthetic at the dentist, because there is a great danger to the life of the person who received the vaccine.</p>	<p>Currently, there is no scientific evidence to support that anesthetics are life-threatening or unsafe to use after receiving the COVID-19 vaccine. There aren't any warning labels on the vaccine ampoules issued by vaccine producers.</p> <p>Surgery, hospitalization, or procedures that require anesthesia are not contra-indications for COVID-19 vaccines. If in doubt, talk to your doctor.</p>

 Claim	Fact 
	<p>Vaccines work, but they only work with other preventative measures. Vaccines will not decrease the spread of the disease until most people are vaccinated.</p>

 Claim	Fact 
	<p>None of the COVID-19 vaccines contain live COVID-19 virus. They do not lead to any infection even if they result in short-lasting side effects such as fever or fatigue. No isolation or quarantine is therefore required.</p>

<p>Claim</p> <p>Everyone who wants to receive the COVID-19 vaccine must get tested by PCR to ensure they are COVID-19 free.</p> <p>Download</p>	<p>Fact</p> <p>COVID-19 vaccines do not cause harm to people who may be infected but are not showing symptoms. <p>Claim</p> <p>People who are currently infected with COVID-19 must get the vaccine.</p> <p>Download</p>	<p>Fact</p> <p>A person infected with COVID-19 doesn't require the vaccine immediately. <p>Claim</p> <p>The period between the two doses of the COVID-19 vaccine should be three months, not one month.</p> <p>Download</p>	<p>Fact</p> <p>The interval period between vaccine doses depends on the type of vaccine.
