





What is accreditation?

Accreditation is a privilege to be invited to participate, without the right to vote, in meetings of the Regional Committee and the possibility to submit statements through the WHO Regional Office.

It is granted to:



Regional nongovernmental organizations



International business associations



Background

- Early approach to invitations of non-State actors to attend Regional Committee was to process them without "aligned and secured criteria"
- With establishment of the **Framework of Engagement with Non-State Actors** in 2016, the decision to proceed with the accreditation process was left to the **Regional Director**
- A procedure for granting accreditation to regional non-State actors not in official relations with WHO to attend meetings of the Regional Committee was established in October 2020


