#### **COVID-19 July Situation Report No.38**

Epi Weeks 27 - 30 (3-30 July 2022)



#### **EPIDEMIOLOGICAL SITUATION**

- As of 30 July 2022, the Eastern Mediterranean Region (EMR) has reported 22 649 341 confirmed COVID-19 cases and 345 100 deaths since the start of the pandemic.
- During the reporting period, in comparison with the previous month<sup>1</sup>:
  - 583 447 new cases reported with 1441 deaths
  - Number of cases increased by 109%
  - Number of deaths increased by 281%
  - Number of conducted tests decreased by 7%
  - 15 countries reported an increase in cases
  - 14 countries reported an increase in deaths
  - One country reported a simultaneous decrease in cases and deaths
- To date, 17 EMR countries have reported the highly transmissible Omicron variant of concern (VOC), with 15 countries reporting BA.1 sub-lineage, 13 countries reporting BA.2 sub-lineage, one country reporting BA.3 sub-lineage, four countries reporting BA.4 sub-lineage, and two countries reporting BA.5 sub-lineage.








### **Graph 1:** Weekly distribution of COVID-19 cases in the Eastern Mediterranean Region

#### REGIONAL RESPONSE HIGHLIGHTS

#### Partnership and Coordination

- Held weekly and monthly support meetings with Health Cluster Coordination (HCC) teams in EMR countries.
- Shared updated WHO guidance and recommendations with all partners.
- Continued to follow up on information shared by country health cluster coordination teams such as the latest epidemiological trends, vaccination data, gaps in the COVID-19 response, coordination of risk communication and community engagement activities, integration of the COVID-19 response in essential health services, and partner activities.

#### **Operations Support and Logistics**

- Dispatched US\$ 1.1 million across 3 WHO geographic regions to support health emergency operations
- Delivered critical COVID-19 health supplies including Dexamethasone, oxygen concentrators, and vaccine carriers to countries from WHO's logistics hub in Dubai

#### **Health Information and Technical Expertise**

#### Infection Prevention and Control (IPC)

- Conducted a one-day training on basic requirements for the IPC programme with a special focus on IPC in emergencies and infection outbreaks targeting 35 directors of nursing units from 21 tertiary and primary health care facilities in Gaza strip, Palestine.
- Reviewed and updated the national COVID-19 IPC guidelines and documents in Sudan.

#### **International Health Regulations and Social Measures**

- Worked with country offices to identify their COVID-19 transmission setting and launch online awareness campaigns to provide better insights and understanding of risk perceptions in the various settings
- Developed a social listening report to guide message development and sharing in response to current rising cases.

#### **Essential Health Services and Systems**

- Initiated the implementation of the Strategic Preparedness, Readiness and Response plan (SPRP); Pillar 9 plan of action for 2022.
- Initiated the second round of the Frontline Service Readiness Assessment in Libya and Afghanistan.
- Supported the Model of Care team in the expert consultation meeting.
- Obtained clearance and submitted a manuscript describing the WHOEMRO approach to developing UHC-PBP; universal health coverage-priority benefits package.

#### COVID-19 Vaccine

- Conducted a country mission to Afghanistan to support the large COVID-10 vaccination campaign.
- Updated the regional and countries partners on the newly-published Global Strategy on COVID-19 Vaccination through the regional working group meeting.
- Supported the eight priority countries (with less than 20% coverage) through the bi-weekly individual country support call which includes all partners and is facilitated by WHO Regional Office colleagues.
- Issued Daily update on COVID-19 vaccination coverage.

#### IN FOCUS: Donors making a difference towards ending COVID-19

### WHO and ECHO support of Sudan for COVID-19 helped scale up the local response to further health emergencies

Thanks to the continued support of the European Civil Protection and Humanitarian Aid Operations (ECHO) in Sudan, WHO has not only been able to navigate the tumult of the COVID-19 pandemic but also respond to other health emerge, particularly traumatic injuries.

WHO supported with 15 vehicles, payment for rapid response teams, capacity-building, provision of PPE and test kits, as well as technical support on surveillance data management. Seven ambulances equipped with PPE and medical supplies to transport COVID-19 patients from the community to primary isolation centers and from hospitals to secondary isolation centers were also donated by WHO. Accordingly, the response to alerts jumped from 2 to 3 days to a maximum of 24 hours.
