# Marking the start of a new phase in supporting mental health in Jordan: Mental Health Investment Case Launch event

Under the patronage of His Royal Highness Prince El Hassan bin Talal, Ministry of Health, in collaboration with WHO and UNDP has launched a report on the prevention and management of mental health conditions in Jordan: the case for investment

The investment case study, which was led by the Ministry of Health in close collaboration with WHO, UNDP in Jordan and the United Nations Inter-Agency Task Force for the Prevention and Control of Noncommunicable Diseases (UNIATF), highlights the urgent need for increased investment in mental health.

The study reveals the economic burden of mental health disorders: in 2023 alone, it was estimated at 251.8 million Jordanian dinars (JOD), equivalent to 0.75% of Jordan's GDP. This includes JOD 53.1 million in direct health care spending and JOD 198.7 million in indirect costs, including lost productivity due to premature death and disability. Furthermore, the study proposed set of strategic actions to translate the projected benefits of scaled-up mental health investment into policy and practice

# Workshop on strengthening the national vaccine pharmacovigilance system

In collaboration with WHO Jordan, Ministry of Health and Jordan Food and Drug Administration conducted a 4-day training workshop to strengthening the national vaccine pharmacovigilance system, by focusing on supporting the Adverse Event Following Immunization (AEFI) surveillance system using WHO methodology of the AEFI causality assessment, and data management. Provided support for reviewing the national AEFI guidelines, aligning them with WHO guidelines and recommendations.

In the efforts to enhance practical training and experience sharing, a visit to a vaccination health facility to observe immunization sessions and discuss AEFI management.

Concluding this mission, MoH, JFDA and Upsala Monitoring Center, WHO Jordan conducted a one-day workshop to provide information on VigiTools and rollout VigiMobile in Jordan. This new tool aims to enhance the electronic reporting of AEFIs, ensuring data capture for better analysis and informed decision-making.



## Community engagement to promote national immunization programme

As part of the national communication campaign on routine immunization in Jordan. The teams of WHO Jordan and RHAS engaged in one of the many community engagement activities across Jordan funded by the European Union Syria Trust Fund. these initiatives aim to raise awareness about the importance of routine vaccinations, ensuring that communities across Jordan are better informed and protected.



## EU, WHO and RHAS recognizing the valuable efforts of community volunteers

## Capacity building of healthcare workers in Jordan

The Ministry of Health and WHO concluded a series of trainings to empower healthcare workers to provide quality parenting services to parents and caregivers - targeting midwives, nurses and general physicians/pediatricians with focus on boosting parental care and child development services in Jordan.

## Ministry of Health and WHO organized a workshop to develop the National Health Promoting Schools Strategy

As part of ongoing efforts to develop a comprehensive National Health Promoting Schools Strategy, the WHO team in Jordan partnered with the Ministry of Health and the Ministry of Education to conduct a two-day workshop focused on strategy development and prioritization.



This collaborative event brought together key stakeholders, including government officials, UN entities, specialized centers, and national NGOs, to discuss and shape a healthier future in schools, ensuring the well-being of students across the country.


## Risk Communication: Spreading Awareness and Countering Misinformation on MPOX

Following the WHO Director-General's recent declaration of the MPOX outbreak as a Public Health Emergency of International Concern, WHO Jordan swiftly developed and launched an evidence-based social media awareness kit.

This initiative, part of the broader Mpx Strategic Preparedness and Response Plan (SPRP), aims to inform and protect communities across Jordan, ensuring timely, accurate information reaches those most at risk.

## Jordan becomes first country in the region to implement Mosaic workshop




The workshop that included around 45 participants representing several senior capacities at the national and subnational levels was concluded with a national consensus to adapt the Mosaic Framework to Enhance National Respiratory Virus Surveillance to respond to emerging threats and allocate resources effectively. The WHO Mosaic Respiratory Surveillance Framework (Mosaic Framework) is a tool that harmonizes and collaboratively tailors' surveillance approaches to specific priority objectives.

## Pandemic influenza and public health emergencies Community Protection Workshop

To strengthen Jordan's national Pandemic Influenza Preparedness and Response Plan, WHO, at all three levels, piloted the first global multisectoral workshop. This initiative brings together national and international agencies to enhance people-centered preparedness and response to influenza and other respiratory viruses with epidemic and pandemic potential.





## Stay Protected: Influenza Vaccination Saves Lives

Influenza vaccination is the best way to prevent influenza.

Vaccination is especially important for people at high risk of influenza complications and their carers.

Annual vaccination is recommended for:

- Pregnant women
- Children aged 6 months to 5 years
- People over age 65
- People with chronic medical conditions
- Health workers.


